 - c. Public Comment (limit 5 minutes/person)
3. Discussion Item(s)
 - a. Discuss Founders Park walk through
 - Comments on how large and beautiful the park is. Paths on the east side emulate the railway that went through Superior at one point in time. Some minimal wear and tear, feel it's underused. Topic for future consideration: expanding the fields or programming if needed.
 - b. Chili & Beer Festival debrief – Saadia & Burton
 - Great event and interest in the community park plans that were there. Talked with interested community members about the open spots on PARC and encouraged them to apply
 - c. PARC Committee Members - Volunteer sign up & support during Fall events

- Need volunteers for events as available, and to have consistent representation for future events. Brent to put together a calendar of events based on historical ones.
- d. Possible games at PARC booth during events
 - Will move to October agenda to discuss how we show up to future events
- e. Ideas on sports equipment check out at SCC front desk
 - No update on designs, budget or front desk plans. PARC to make a formal recommendation to town council.
- f. Potential PARC collaboration with ACES & CAPS
 - Brent met with James from ACES and has brought up a need for a water conservation plan. Recommend the upcoming consultant that is reviewing parks to consider watering improvements. Potential for more collaboration with them ACES to bring together united goals between committees. Lindsay and Burton feel strongly about reducing water usage across parks when it can be done. PARC supports this initiative.

4. New Business and Updates

- a. Passports & Maps as gifts – Tim
 - Would like to implement passports for stamping at each park, people can bring passports and emboss them with a stamp to complete the full book. Tim researched printing and currently came up with \$6 as a high cost.
- b. Updates from Town Staff & Council Liaison
 - North Pool project delayed until fall of 2026 due to budget and equipment delays. Plan changed to bid both North and South pools to be completed for the opening of season in 2027. May have preliminary designs for South Pool in November meeting.
 - Community Park playground equipment has been ordered – slated to end by April 2026, goal is for it to open in May 2026.
 - Central Park landscape is progressing, shelter and restrooms will be in place in November.
 - Consultant Design Concepts started a scorecard of evaluating all parks in early October.
 - E-bike proposed ordinance was discussed with the Town Council and there are concerns about e-motorcycles being ridden by small kids over 40+ mph without helmets. Working on raising awareness on what is/isn't legal to ride. Ordinance will address class 1, 2, and 3 e-bikes and usage on trails.

- Events have gone from 4 to 40 and looking to consolidate the not-well-attended events. Potentially will consider stopping Arbor Day and Bike to Work Day. Also beginning to prepare for Sundance 2027.
