4. Standing Updates (7:50)

a. Raptor Program - The raptor monitoring program currently has over 70 members-we picked up a few new folks at National Trails Day!! It continues to be an exciting time in Superior with the raptor nesting season. During the period of May 1st thru June 1st, the raptor monitoring program observed the following: 26 Great Horned Owls, 25 Red-Tailed Hawks, 12 American Kestrels, 6 Cooper's Hawks, 3 Bald Eagles, 2 Burrowed Owls (technically Boulder Open Space- near Oermann Roche Trailhead), 1 Peregrine Falcon (Total 75)

We had a fantastic May raptor walk... saw tremendous activity of red-tailed hawks and American Kestrels in Community Park.
